

Below are follow up questions for you to consider related to today's message *All Lost; Romans 3:9-20*.

Discussion Questions:

1. What evidence does God bring to these three groups to show them their guilt before him? Cite verses from Rom. 1-3
 - a. *I didn't know*
 - b. *I'm better than you*
 - c. *I've got religion*
2. Why are people who know the Bible not necessarily better off in being righteous before God?
3. How do you see the universality of sin in our world? In your own life?
4. Do you find it hard to agree with the indictment of 3:10-18? Does it seem unfair or overstated? How have your thoughts about this changed since you first heard this passage?
5. Why is God's desire to silence all people in his courtroom an expression of "friendly criticism"?
6. How could embracing these truths shake us out of complacency, apathy, and sluggishness?
7. How do you see in Jesus the opposite of the qualities described in vv. 10-18? Work through each one, give examples.
8. Have you received salvation through Jesus? If not, why not?
9. Do you feel challenged by this passage to share Jesus with people? What is the biggest difficulty you face to telling more people about Jesus more often?
10. How might meditating and soaking in this passage stir joy and passion for Christ?
