

Below are follow up questions for you to consider related to today's message *The Traitor Within*, Romans 7:7-25.

Discussion Questions:

1. What did sin do to the person in Romans 7:7-13?
2. What does sin do to the person in Romans 7:14-25?
3. Do you believe Romans 7:14-25 describes a Christian or an unbeliever? Why? What reasons were given in the sermon for seeing this as a believer?
4. Have you discovered that indwelling sin is a law, a force, a power that lives inside you and has the power to move you toward evil?
5. Have you found this to be the case personally? When and how did this happen?
6. Are you aware that the moment you set out to do good, this evil power sticks its foot out to trip you? Where have you seen this in your life recently?
7. Do you carry a healthy self-suspicion that sin could be deceiving you, creating blind spots? How does one find out where those blind spots are?
8. Are you learning to daily, constantly look to Christ, the rock of our salvation, our only hope, our prophet, priest and king? What helps you do this?
9. Where do we need to be honest with ourselves about our sin?
10. Where would it be healthy for us to say, "miserable person that I am, isn't there anyone who can rescue me?" so that we can get to: yes! His name is Jesus.
