

Below are follow up questions for you to consider related to today's message *Radical Generosity*; Luke 12:13-21.

Discussion Questions:

1. How do you feel about the Christmas season? What difficulties does it create for you? What opportunities does it open up for loving people around you?
2. What are the three lies the farmer believed?
3. How does the gospel turn the lies around?
4. How do you guard against covetousness? Do you have a “covetousness alarm” to warn you?
5. What are the three steps the sermon recommended to live an increasingly generous life?
6. Where have you given something away (time, money, gift, etc.) and found joy? Did that surprise you?
7. How should a Christian decide how much to give?
