Discussion Questions:

1. What is the difference between knowing about grace and experiencing its life-changing power?
2. What are ways you see the life-changing power of God's grace in this passage?
3. Why do people often encounter grace on their way to the bottom? Where have you seen this?
4. Read Matthew 12:38-41. What are 5 ways Jesus is greater than Jonah?
5. How can we learn to live in the life-changing power of grace when we are not in a crisis?
6. What are the idols of our city? How is Christ a better savior?
7. What does this passage teach us about revival?
8. What can we learn from this passage about God's perspective about social justice?
