- 1. What is repentance and how do you see it in the way the king and people of Nineveh respond to Jonah's sermon? How can this help us in our repentance?
- 2. For all his faults, Jonah did go and preach in Nineveh. Where are the places we don't go to talk about Jesus because it's too dangerous or risky?
- 3. What does this passage show us about the mercy of God?
- 4. What does this passage teach us about how God thinks about cities and societies?
- 5. Why is Jonah so mad? What is he trying to protect?
- 6. What is the difference between loving your country and loving it too much?
- 7. Where are Christians today feeling threatened and in danger of responding like Jonah?
- 8. What are five ways Jesus is better than Jonah? Can you find Scripture to support each one?
