

Below are discussion questions for you to consider related to today's message "The Raging Prophet" from Jonah 3:6-4:4.

Discussion Questions:

1. What is repentance and how do you see it in the way the king and people of Nineveh respond to Jonah's sermon? How can this help us in our repentance?
2. For all his faults, Jonah did go and preach in Nineveh. Where are the places we don't go to talk about Jesus because it's too dangerous or risky?
3. What does this passage show us about the mercy of God?
4. What does this passage teach us about how God thinks about cities and societies?
5. Why is Jonah so mad? What is he trying to protect?
6. What is the difference between loving your country and loving it too much?
7. Where are Christians today feeling threatened and in danger of responding like Jonah?
8. What are five ways Jesus is better than Jonah? Can you find Scripture to support each one?
