LEADER

"He was despised and rejected by men, a man of sorrows and acquainted with grief; and as one from whom men hide their faces he was despised, and we esteemed him not.

CONGREGATION

Surely he has borne our griefs and carried our sorrows; yet we esteemed him stricken, smitten by God, and afflicted.

LEADER

But he was pierced for our transgressions; he was crushed for our iniquities; upon him was the chastisement that brought us peace, and with his wounds we are healed.

CONGREGATION

All we like sheep have gone astray; we have turned — every one — to his own way; and the Lord has laid on him the iniquity of us all."

Good Friday Narrative

Tonight's service will conclude with a series of readings taking us through Jesus' betrayal, crucifixion, and death. After each reading a candle is blown out until the final candle is quenched, symbolizing Jesus' death. We end our service in silence without a benediction, as we await the news of the resurrection on Easter Sunday morning.
